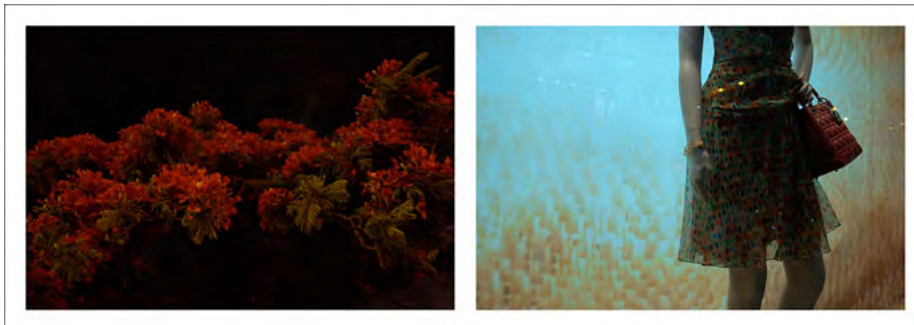

The creative process...

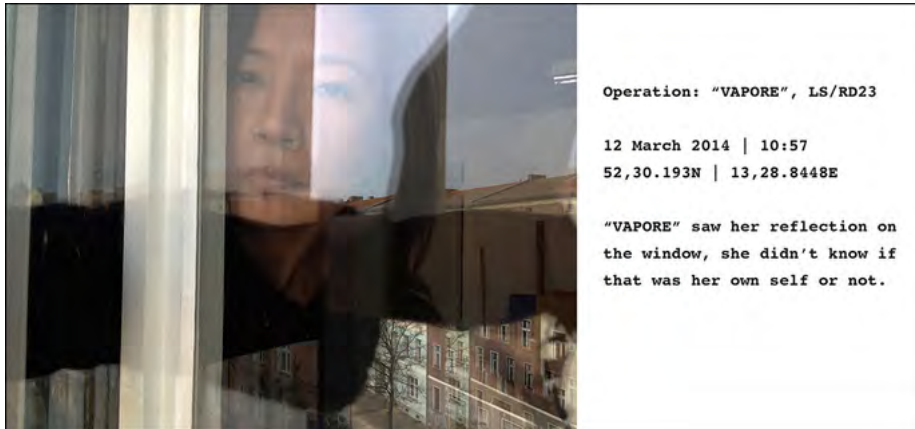
